

Guidance for Parents at Streatham House Nursery



15 & 30 Hours Funded Places

2021/2022 Academic Year

15 hours Funded Places (Universal Entitlement)

All 3 to 4-year-olds in England can get up to 570 funded hours per academic year. Based on 38 weeks of funding provision. We then equally spread this provision over 50 weeks per year.

30 Hour Funded Places (Universal + Extended Entitlement)

Working parents of 3- and 4-year-olds in England may be entitled to up to 30 funded hours of childcare, for 38 weeks of the year (or fewer hours over more weeks). This is an additional 15 hours of funded childcare on top of the 15 hours universal entitlement for 3- and 4-year-olds in England. Again this is available for 38 weeks per year and we spread this over 50 weeks.

Am I eligible for a 30-hour funded place?

You will be eligible for 30 hours of funded childcare if:

- Your child is under 12 years old, or your child is disabled and under 17 years old for Tax-Free Childcare.
- You may be able to claim 30 hours if your child is 3 or 4 and not taking up a state funded reception place. (30 hours is available in England only.)
- The child you're applying for usually lives with you – you don't have to be their parent.
- You live and work in the UK, unless you're a Crown servant or member of HM Armed Forces posted overseas.
- You, and any partner, are working, and each earning at least the National Minimum Wage or Living Wage for 16 hours a week – in 2021/22 this is £140 if you're over 25– but less than £100,000 a year each.
- If you're under 25 or an apprentice, you should expect to earn the equivalent of 16 hours, at the National Minimum Wage or Living Wage which applies to you.

You can still apply for 30 hours funded childcare if you're:

- On paid sick leave.
- On paid ordinary or additional maternity, paternity or adoption leave, or getting Maternity Allowance, for another child.
- On paid shared parental leave.
- On paid annual leave.

You can also apply if you're not working but expect to start a new job in the next 31 days.

How is my 15 hours spread over 50 weeks in Streatham House?

Eligible parents are entitled to 15 hours a week for 38 weeks of the academic year. (Autumn, Spring and Summer Terms). At Streatham House we stretch this offer over 50 weeks of the year (September to August).

The equal spreading and the numbers of hours per week is based on when your child becomes eligible.

Eligible from	Autumn Term (14 weeks)	Spring Term (11 weeks)	Summer Term (13 weeks)	Total Funded Hours
September	15 x 14 = 210	15 x 11 = 165	15 x 13 = 195	570
January	N/A	15 x 11 = 165	15 x 13 = 195	360
April	N/A	N/A	15 x 13 = 195	195

Example 1

- Johnny attends 2 days a week and is eligible for 15 hours funding from the Autumn Term:

Funded hours are calculated as follows:

15 (hours) x 38 (weeks) / 12 months (Sept - Aug) = 47.5 funded hours per month.

Fees payable:

Current 2 Day Monthly Rate – £199.98 (47.5 x £4.21 Sefton's current hourly funding rate)

Example 2

- Anna attends 2 days a week and is eligible for 15 hours funding from the Spring Term:

Funded hours are calculated as follows:

15 (hours) x 24 (weeks) / 8 months (Jan - Aug) = 45 funded hours per month.

Fees payable:

Current 2 Day Monthly Rate – £189.45 (45 x £4.21 Sefton's current hourly funding rate)

Example 3

- Julian attends 2 days a week and is eligible for 15 hours funding from the Summer Term:

Funded hours are calculated as follows:

15 (hours) x 13 (weeks) / 5 months (April - Aug) = 39 funded hours per month.

Fees payable: Current 2 Day Monthly Rate – £164.19 (39 x £4.21 Sefton's current hourly funding rate)

How is my 30 hours spread over 50 weeks Streatham House?

Eligible parents are entitled to 30 hours a week in each of the 38 weeks of the academic year (Autumn, Spring and Summer Terms). At Streatham House we stretch this offer over 50 weeks of the year

The equal spreading and the numbers of hours per week is based on when your child becomes eligible.

Eligible from	Autumn Term (14 weeks)	Spring Term (11 weeks)	Summer Term (13 weeks)	Total Funded Hours
September	30 x 14 = 420	30 x 11 = 330	30 x 13 = 390	1140
January	N/A	30 x 11 = 330	30 x 13 = 390	720
April	N/A	N/A	30 x 13 = 390	390

Example 4

- Sarah attends 2 days and is eligible for 30 hours funding from the Autumn Term:

Funded hours are calculated as follows:

$30 \text{ (hours)} \times 38 \text{ (weeks)} / 12 \text{ months (Sept - Aug)} = 95 \text{ funded hours per month.}$

Fees payable:

Current 2 Day Monthly Rate – £399.95 (95 x £4.21 Sefton’s current hourly funding rate)

Example 5

- Mark attends 2 days a week and is eligible for 30 hours funding from the Spring Term:

Funded hours are calculated as follows:

$30 \text{ (hours)} \times 24 \text{ (weeks)} / 8 \text{ months (Jan - Aug)} = 90 \text{ funded hours per month.}$

Fees payable:

Current 2 Day Monthly Rate – £378.90 (90 x £4.21 Sefton’s current hourly funding rate)

Example 6

- Ruby attends 2 days a week and is eligible for 30 hours funding from the Summer Term:

Funded hours are calculated as follows:

$30 \text{ (hours)} \times 13 \text{ (weeks)} / 5 \text{ months (April - Aug)} = 78 \text{ funded hours per month.}$

Fees payable:

Current 2 Day Monthly Rate – £328.38 (78 x £4.21 Sefton’s current hourly funding rate)
